## **COMPANY HISTORY**

The origins of the Ballets Russes de Monte Carlo can be traced back to 1909, when Serge Diaghilev signed a contract with the Theatre Chatelet in Paris to present a Russian ballet season. Drawing from the Russian Imperial Theater, he assembled a company which included Michel Fokine, Anna Pavlova, Tamara Karsavina, Vera Karalli, Ida Rubinstein, Vaslav Nijinsky, Adolph Bolm, Mikhail Mordkin, and Theodore Kosloff. After two successful seasons in Paris in 1909 and 1910, Diaghilev formed the group into a permanent company. Between 1911 and Diaghilev's death in 1929, the company presented premiers of many new ballets by Vaslav Nijinsky, Michel Fokine and Leonide Massine. Diaghilev's company gave a final performance on July 26, 1929 at Covent Garden Theater in London.

After Diaghilev's death, two organizations emerged which sought to continue the work of his ballet company. Rene Blum formed the Ballet de l'Opera at Monte Carlo and Col. Wassily de Basil and Prince Zeretelli collaborated in the presentation of the Opera Russe in Paris. Eventually, Blum and Basil merged these groups into one company based in Monte Carlo. Blum oversaw the artistic aspects and de Basil assumed responsibility for business affairs. The two hired George Balanchine and Leonide Massine as choreographers and many of the finest Russian dancers, including Irina Baronova, Tamara Toumanova, and Tatiana Riabouchinska. Known as the Rene Blum and Col. de Basil's Ballets Russes de Monte Carlo, the company presented ballets from the Diaghilev repertoire and new ballets by Massine and Balanchine.

Personality conflicts between de Basil and Massine led to Massine's departure in 1938. Massine joined Blum in Monte Carlo, where Blum was forming a ballet company for the Monte Carlo Opera, in partnership with a corporation known as World Art, Inc. At the head of this corporation were two American businessmen, Julius Fleischmann and Sergei I. Denham. Many of the corps of the Ballets Russes left de Basil to join this new group, including Alexandra Danilova, Tamara Toumanova, Eleonora Marra, Roland Guerard, Marc Platoff, and George Zoritch. De Basil's company received another blow when S. Hurok decided to give his American bookings to Blum's new company.

The two companies attempted a merger in March 1938 but continued personality conflicts led to a permanent separation in June 1938. Litigation arose between de Basil and Massine over who owned the rights to ballets Massine had choreographed during the Diaghilev era. Due to this lawsuit, de Basil stepped down from directorship of his company and appointed Victor Dandre, German Sevastianov, and W.G. Perkins to oversee a season in London at the Covent Garden Theater. Massine, meanwhile, continued his association with Blum's Ballet de Monte Carlo and participated in a London season at the Theatre Royal in July 1938.

De Basil's company changed its name to Educational Ballets, Ltd. and then later to the Original Ballet Russe. In Fall 1940, both companies presented seasons at the 51st Theatre in New York, with the Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo featuring Danilova, Markova, Youskavitch, and Eglevsky and the Original Ballet Russe presenting Baronova, Toumanova, and Riabouchinska.

The Original Ballet Russe suffered a gradual decline in its reputation during the 1940s. After touring Australia, the United States, and Cuba between 1940 and 1941, the company experienced conflict and division when several dancers decided to stage a strike over unpaid salaries in March 1941. As a result, the company's American booking agent, S. Hurok, withdrew his support. The company managed to resolve these differences and hired a new impresario, Fortune Grallo, who

oversaw the company's tour of South America between 1942 and 1945. Unfortunately, it proved unable to attract the audiences of its competitor, the Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo. Many critics felt the company had lost the style and atmosphere of the Diaghilev era and found its repertory passe.

After unsuccessful seasons in New York, Paris, and London, the company toured Spain and gave its last performance on the island of Mallorca on November 8, 1948. An attempt was made to revive the Original Ballet Russe after Basil's death in 1951. Under the artistic direction of George Kirsta and the general direction of Vova Grigoriev, the company was registered in August 1951 as Universal Ballet, Ltd. It conducted a brief tour of England in the winter of 1951-52 but met with disastrous critical reception and was forced to liquidate due to financial difficulties.

Blum and Massine's Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo experienced greater success and performed throughout the world during the 1940s and 1950s. A well-received New York season in 1938 led to bookings at auditoriums across the United States. S. Hurok remained the official American booking agent for the company until 1943, when a contract was signed with Columbia Concerts. This association lasted only a short time and by the end of 1943, David Libidnis had been hired to handle bookings. Sergei Denham assumed directorship of the company in 1948 and oversaw successful U.S. tours between 1949 and 1950. After 1950, the company continued to make sporadic tours of the United States until 1962, when it gave its last public performance.

## **SCOPE AND CONTENTS**

The Ballets Russes Collection traces the history of Serge Diaghilev's Ballets Russes and its various offshoots, including de Basil and Blum's Ballets Russes de Monte Carlo, the Original Ballet Russe, and Massine and Denham's Ballets Russes de Monte Carlo. Each variation of the company is well-documented through programs, press reviews, publicity, and photos.

Records on the various versions of the company all include house programs from theaters around the world, as well as the beautifully illustrated souvenir programs produced to commemorate each season. Publicity in the form of flyers, posters, and playbills is also present for each generation of the Ballet Russe and reveals the various venues where the company performed during its fifty years of activity. Newsclippings and articles from periodicals provide reviews of specific performances, as well as critical evaluations of the company's achievements and contributions to modern ballet.

Diaghilev's efforts to utilize the talents of eminent painters for set and program designs are well-documented in the souvenir programs and editions of Comoedia Illustrate contained within this collection. Artists featured include Leon Bakst, Henri Matisse, Natalia Gontcharova, Andre Derain, and Pablo Picasso.

Photographic documentation for the company is not as complete. A few photos of Serge Diaghilev and several performers provide limited visual documentation of the first Ballet Russe's activities. De Basil and Blum's version of the company is somewhat better documented in photos of performances from the 1930s. Photo files are completely absent from the materials on de Basil's Original Ballet Russe. Massine and Denham's Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo is most thoroughly documented through photo files on performances, individual dancers, and company tours.

Retrospective evaluations of the Ballet Russes are also present in the form of recent news articles and publications from museum exhibitions held within the last twenty years.
